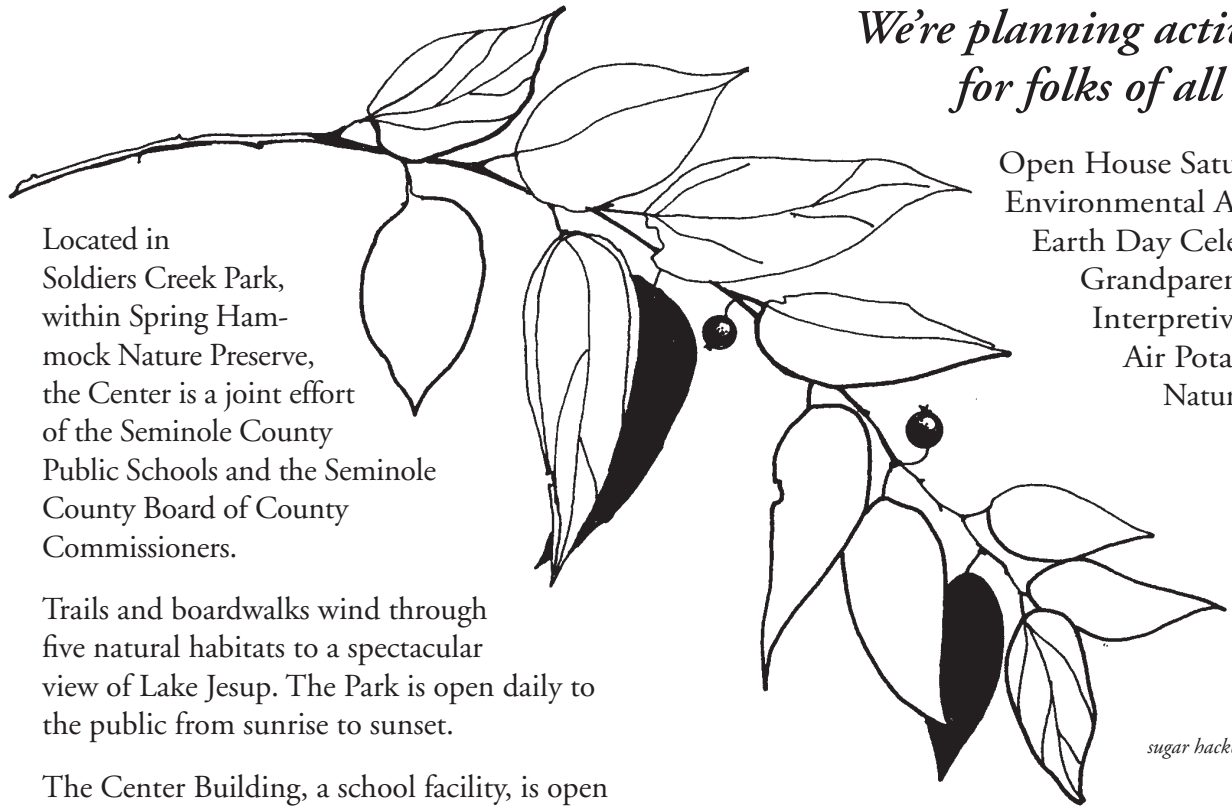

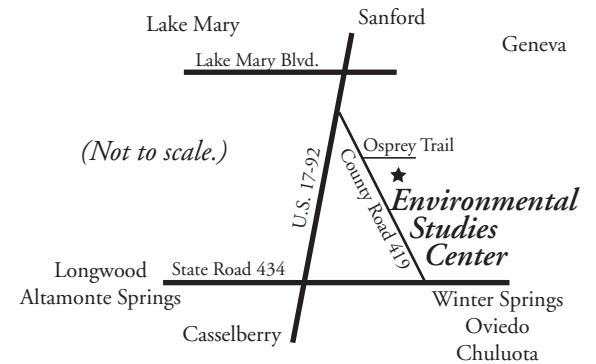
Located in Soldiers Creek Park, within Spring Hammock Nature Preserve, the Center is a joint effort of the Seminole County Public Schools and the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners.

Trails and boardwalks wind through five natural habitats to a spectacular view of Lake Jesup. The Park is open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

The Center Building, a school facility, is open during school hours for students in first and fifth grades to participate in exciting environmental programs. A highlight of each student's visit is the Natural History Museum. Here, students get to see a live baby alligator, hold a real snake, watch turtles, observe a bee hive, and interact with a variety of natural objects.

The Friends of the Environmental Studies Center was formed to support current programs, expand and enhance facilities, and provide planned activities for the public in this beautiful park, while building environmental awareness in the community.
